## PRINCIPAL ASSESSED TAXES.

**ARMORIAL BEARINGS.** Any person keeping a coach or other carriage, and using or wearing any armorial bearing, to pay annually 2*l.* 8*s.* Any person not keeping a coach, &c., but liable to the house or window duty, to pay annually 1*l.* 4*s.* and every other description of persons 12*s.* annually.

**CARRIAGES.**—For every coach, chariot, landau, chaise, caravan, &c. with four wheels (except carriages or coaches licensed by the Commissioners for managing the stamp duties) is to be paid as follows:—

For every additional body used on the same carriage, 3*l.* 3*s.*—For every carriage kept for the purpose of being let to hire without horses, for any time less than one year, 6*l.* For every such carriage let to hire for travelling post, by the day, or mile, by any post-master or inn-keeper, &c. duly licensed; and for every stage coach or diligence, with 4 wheels, duly entered, 5*l.* 5*s.*—For every calash, chair, &c. with 2 or 3 wheels, drawn by 1 horse, 3*l.* 5*s.* Ditto, if drawn by two or more horses or mules, 4*l.* 10*s.*—And for every additional body successively used on calashes, chaises, curricles, chairs, or cars, with less than 4 wheels, 1*l.* 11*s.* 6*d.*

Four-wheel carriages, drawn by one horse only, 4*l.* 10*s.* each.—Four-wheel carriages, with each wheel of less diameter than 30 inches, drawn by ponies or mules, exceeding 12 hands, and neither of them exceeding 13 hands in height, 3*l.* 5*s.* each.—Carriages used by common carriers, and occasionally carrying passengers, with four wheels, 2*l.* 10*s.*; two wheels, 1*l.* 5*s.* each.

Carriages with less than 4 wheels, drawn by 1 horse, without any metallic springs, and constructed and marked as described by Act 3 and 4 Geo. IV., c. 39, and not exceeding 21*l.* value; also common-stage carts constructed for the carriage of goods, and occasionally used for riding, are exempt.

**DOGS.** For every greyhound kept by any person, whether his property or not, 1*l.* For every other species of dog, where more than one is kept, 14*s.* And every person who shall inhabit any dwelling-house, assessed to any of the duties on inhabited houses, or on windows or lights, and shall keep one dog and no more, not being of the above description, 8*s.* for such dog.

But this duty is not to extend to dogs not six months old; the proof of which to lie on the owner, on an appeal to the commissioners.

Persons compounding for their hounds to be charged 36*l.*

Farmers, with farms under 100*l.* value, and shepherds having a direct interest in the flocks they tend, are exempt for dogs kept for care of sheep.

**GAME.** Every deputed gamekeeper must take a certificate from the clerk of the peace, and pay annually 1*l.* 5*s.*—Every other person, 3*l.* 13*s.*—Fee for the certificate, 1*s.*—Any person killing game without a certificate, forfeits 20*l.*—Persons refusing to show their certificates, or to tell their names and places of abode to a person having a certificate, forfeit 50*l.*

Certificates do not exempt unqualified persons from the former laws.

Gamekeeper hunting out of his manor, is deemed to have no certificate.

**DEALERS.** Persons licensed to deal in Game are to take out a certificate, charged with a duty of 2*l.*; but certificated persons may sell Game to licensed dealers, if paying the duty of 3*l.* 13*s.* 6*d.*

**HAIR-POWDER.** Every person who wears it to pay annually 1*l.* 3*s.* 6*d.*

No person to pay for more than two unmarried daughters.

**HORSES.** For every horse, mare, or gelding, used for riding or drawing carriages, pay annually—

For horses let to hire, each 1*l.* 8*s.* 9*d.*—Race-horses, each, 3*l.* 10*s.*

Butchers' Horses.—Where one is kept only for his trade, 1*l.* 8*s.* 9*d.*; and where two are kept, 10*s.* 6*d.* for the second.

Horses not exceeding 13 hands high, used for riding or drawing any carriage, 1*l.* 1*s.* each.



Horses used by bailiffs solely in the concern of any farm are exempt. Other horses of 13 hands high, and mules, pay each annually, 10s. 6d. Mares kept solely for breeding, exempt from duty whilst so kept. Farmers allowed to use one of their husbandry horses, free of the riding horse duty, to ride to market, church, elections, or to commissions of appeal. A husbandry horse, occasionally ridden by any one occupying a farm of less annual value than 100*l.* is exempt: as are also horses employed by market gardeners in their business. Also, horses of clergymen of every persuasion, with a stipend under 120*l.* one horse each duty free. Husbandry horses, though rode occasionally, and one horse, where the farm is less than 500*l.* Horses rode by bailiff or herdsman.—Hackney coach horses, and horses which have not at any time been used, are wholly exempt. SERVANT-MEN. Masters to pay yearly for one, 1*l.* 4s. \*—Two, 1*l.* 11s. each.—Three, 1*l.* 18s. each.—Four, 2*l.* 3s. 6d. each.—Five, 2*l.* 9s. each.—Six, 2*l.* 11s. 6d. each.—Seven, 2*l.* 12s. 6d. each.—Eight, 2*l.* 16s. each.—Nine, 3*l.* 1s. each.—Ten, 3*l.* 6s. 6d. each.—Eleven, and upwards, 3*l.* 16s. 6d. each. Bachelors (Roman Catholic clergymen excepted) to pay annually additional for every man-servant, 1*l.* For every Waiter in any tavern, alehouse, eating-house, or lodging-house (being an eating-house) 1*l.* 10s. Every Coachman, Groom, &c. let to hire for any period less than one year, 1*l.* 5s. To be paid by the person letting them out. No servants to be paid for, if wholly employed in husbandry, manufactures, or trade. Two parish apprentices to be allowed, unless wearing a livery. Disabled officers on half-pay may keep one servant, duty free. Every one to give in a list of all their servants in 14 days after notice given them, or forfeit 10*l.*—The same to be done with respect to horses and carriages.—After the list is given in, they are to pay for their servants, &c. there specified, to April 5 following, whether they have them or not.

Every window exceeding 11 feet, by 4 feet 6 in. to be charged as two windows, except those so made before April 5, 1785, and shops, warehouses, &c. To include all sky-lights, windows in staircases, garrets, cellars, passages, and all other parts of dwelling-houses, whether adjoining or not; and to be charged yearly upon the occupier. Windows giving light to more than one room, to be charged as separate windows. Distinct chambers or apartments in any of the Inns of Court or Chancery, or in any College or Hall in either of the Universities of Oxford or Cambridge, or any public hospital; also houses divided in different tenements, being distinct properties; where the number of windows does not in each case respectively exceed 7, to be charged 1s. 9d. for each window; where

\* This rate of duty (1*l.* 4s.) is payable for every male person employed in any of the capacities, Sch. C. No. 1, and not being a servant to his employer, if the employer shall otherwise be chargeable to the above duties on servants, or for any carriage, or for more than one horse kept for riding, or drawing any taxable carriage. And if the employer shall not be chargeable to such other duties, then the sum of 10s. is payable for every such male person employed.



the number of windows exceed 7, to be charged as if the same were as an entire house.

Windows in dwelling-houses, used wholly for the purpose of a manufactory, warehouses, or workshops, and not having any communication with the dwelling-house, are exempt; and also windows (not exceeding three) in front shops and warehouses on the ground story, though communicating with the dwelling-houses.

Windows and lights in farm-houses, occupied by a tenant, for the purposes of husbandry only, or by the owner for the purpose of husbandry only, valued under 200*l.* per annum, are exempt, provided the occupier shall not derive any profit or income exceeding 100*l.* per annum from any other source than the said farm.
