I replied that I had seen from the Press that such an agreement was in contemplation but according to this information, it contained nothing beyond a Treaty of friendship. At any rate, we had not yet received the agreement for registration,

The Marquis Medici replied that this was his information too ~~but as regards the Treaty~~ he believed that there were certain annexes *to the Treaty* which might put a completely different complexion on the sense of the agreement.

I said to him that I was grateful for this information and that I would take an occasion ^a of explaining the matter to ~~the~~ Bulgarian representative, informing him, of course, that if a Treaty was presented for registration, it must be full and nothing kept back.

He said that this ^{was} ~~is~~ what he hoped would be done.

There is no reason to deal with the matter

here. We can talk to Monsieur Mikoff about
it in Geneva.
