

TO THE HONOURABLE THE COMMONS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND
IRELAND IN PARLIAMENT ASSEMBLED, THE PETITION
OF THE UNDERSIGNED

SHEWETH :—

THAT the conduct of the Inhabitants of Warsaw during the late sanguinary excesses of the Russian Authorities in that City proves the capacity of the people of Poland for self-government and for the enjoyment of the Institutions guaranteed to them by the Treaties of 1815.

THAT Great Britain is herself attacked, and endangered by the violation of those Treaties.

THAT the attempt to extinguish Poland renders that country a constant source of danger and disturbance to Europe, and is part of that system of aggression which is so fixed and dominant a principle of Muscovite policy, in defiance of all international law, and in direct opposition to the interest and security of this and other countries.

THAT no information has ever been laid before Parliament in reference to the submission of England to the violation of the Treaties of 1815 by the suppression of the Laws, Liberties, Constitution, and distinct existence of Poland.

THAT no Protest has ever been made against that violation.

Your Petitioners therefore pray your Honorable House to advise Her Majesty, by a loyal Address, to suspend all Diplomatic intercourse with Russia until the Kingdom of Poland be restored, and reparation be made for the violation of the Treaties of Vienna during its extinction.
